Coronavirus update - links to information and resources

New York State is under a Stay-at-Home (PAUSE) directive until further notice!

What is "Stay-at-Home" or PAUSE?

People should not leave their homes except for essentials such as groceries and medicine or emergencies. When outside, cover your nose and mouth with a scarf, bandana or mask and practice social distancing. Businesses that do not provide essential services must close and send workers home. Businesses considered essential could include grocery stores, restaurants that do take out service, pharmacies, organizations that provide services for vulnerable populations, first responders and hardware stores. Public transportation continue to operate to get nurses, doctors, law enforcement officers, and other essential personnel where they need to go. Everyone else: Limit the use of public transportation to only when necessary.

I am collecting donations of phone chargers and used smartphones for patients hospitalized at Bellevue. As you probably have heard, hospitals are restricting visitors due to infection risk, and one of the most difficult aspects of this disease is being alone while sick in the hospital. Many patients arrive to the Emergency Room without their phone charger. Hospital staff are charging phones when we can so patients can keep in touch with family, but the infection risk is not insignificant.

A bag to collect these items will be available at the service entrance of The Carlton Regency, 137 East 36th Street, NE corner of Lexington Avenue. The service entrance is on the plaza level 36th Street side. The best time to drop off donations is daily from 8am-8pm.

Important 2020 Census Dates

An Important NYC 2020 Census Message from Cardi B: youtube.com/watch?v=znXv63ZeEb4

There are 3 ways to respond to the Census: online, by phone, by mail. Census workers will visit homes that have not responded.

April 1 is a key reference date for the 2020 Census. When completing the census, include everyone living in your home on April 1, 2020. The census contains only 10 questions, and none ask about employment, income, immigration, citizenship, or for your Social Security number. The census asks how many people are living or staying in your home, their sex, age, race, and ethnicity, whether your home is owned or rented, your home address. All responses are confidential and protected by law. If you are responding online, you must complete the census in one sitting, as you won't have the ability to save your progress. **See the questions the census asks:**

<https://2020census.gov/en/about-questions.html>. The census is available online and by phone this year: my2020census.gov and 1-844-330-2020. If you need help filling out your census, you can email NY12CensusHelp@mail.house.gov.

April 8-16: Reminder letters and paper questionnaires will be delivered to remaining households that have not responded.

April 20-27: Final reminder postcards will be delivered to households that have not yet responded before census takers follow up in person.

May 13-extended to August 14: If a household does not respond to any of the invitations, a census taker will follow up in person. Also, please, beware of scams. No one should be knocking on your door claiming to be a Census Taker or Enumerator, since now that phase will not begin until early summer. So for now, do not open the door to anyone claiming to be with the Census. If you respond to the Census 2020 survey immediately when you get the invitation, nobody should be knocking on your door.

December 2020: The Census Bureau will deliver apportionment counts to the President and Congress as required by law.

by March 2021: The Census Bureau will send redistricting counts to states. This information is used to redraw legislative districts based on population changes.

Important Election Dates

The **PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY** has been rescheduled to **June 23**. In New York State, you must be registered with a party to vote in that party's primary elections. There will be no Republican Presidential Primaries this year (Donald Trump is the only Republican presidential candidate.) Bernie Sanders has dropped out of the Democratic Presidential race, but will remain on the ballot. **Everyone is encouraged to apply for an Absentee Ballot using "temporary illness" as the reason. You can list a date range with an end date after November 3 to cover the General Election. Link to the application form below.** You can apply now for an absentee ballot and later can decide later whether or not to use it.
